# Sandlot 2009 Summer Hitting League Summary (Week 7)

## Overall Summary:

Week #7 has to have been the most exciting Hitting League week of the season. Thirteen (13) of Twenty-Six (26), an amazing 50%, of the hitters achieved their personal bests during the week. The softball division saw two of the top three teams go down to defeat as a champion emerged. The baseball (11U) division continued to be a battle to the end with two teams tied for the division and one team close behind. It is still anyone's championship to take. Finally, the baseball (8U) division continued an incredible improvement stretch with three of four hitters achieving their personal bests for the 2nd consecutive week.

## Junior Bracket Summary:

Week #7 continued the dominance of the divisions top three teams, Homerun Hitters, Blue Thunder, and All-Stars. With only one game separating the three, all three took victories this week. Homerun Hitters downed Soap 69-66, Blue Thunder squeaked past Grand Slammers 63-62, and All-Stars defeated Blue Lightning 78-68.
